It was during Pastor Dave Hoyt's appointment to our church that Ruth's Harvest Pantry came into being, through his support and the work of Joanne DiNardo and others. When Pastor Dave visited this summer as a guest speaker he was interested to see how the pantry has grown, and was amazed at how many freezers and refrigerators

now inhabit the area. Pastor Dave was pleased to know that this church continues to feed people who are food insecure, and that we do it more generously than when the food pantry first began.

On another note, Thanksgiving baskets will be given out this year on the fourth Saturday of November, the same day as our normal food pantry distribution. ANYONE may receive a basket of food to help supplement their Thanksgiving meal, but you MUST SIGN UP either during food pantry hours (4th Saturday of September and October from 8-10) or by calling Jamie in the church office, Tuesday-Friday from 9AM-2PM.

My thanks to all the volunteers who have kept, and continue to keep, the food pantry functioning and vital in our church and community.


Bishop Bickerton's greeting to the New England Annual Conference and bio/introduction are posted.



PUT ON THE WHOLE ARMOR OF GOD.

[Paul, watching the Roman Guard's drills, writes this to the Ephesians: 6:10-18.]

*Living Scripture requires discipline.
*Being prepared is to pray with power.
Paul's prison teaching is a call to action for adults - to outfit ourselves so as to advance the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

*Belt of Truth = skip the white lies, drama, exagerations, rumors, and conspiracy theories. Learn discernment - read the written Word.

*Breastplate of Righteousness -- Think of the Trinity: Are you reading the Almighty's Word regularly? Are you aware you reflect the face of Jesus to others? Do you pause often to listen to the Holy Spirit working in you?

*Shoes for the Gospel of Peace, [notice it says: <u>PEACE!</u>]. Sometimes shoes will be slippers to go forth gently. Sometimes combat boots, (prayer is a battle). Sometimes you need to remove your shoes - the ground around you is holy.

*Shield of Faith to quench the flaming arrows of the evil one, (ominous?]: Deep Prayer <u>is</u> dangerous work....But...You are a Child of God, who has only <u>one</u> enemy, (already mortally wounded). You will grow to become a Warrior in the Lord's Army, (fearless!). You will mature to become an Ambassador for Christ, (judicious).

*Helmet of Salvation: It's about your mind: What you think is what you say: What you say is what you end up doing. What you do, defines who you hang with. Who you hang with impacts your thinking, (etc.). Scripture is your Helmet: it guards your thoughts, protects your ears, eyes; and silences your mouth.

*Sword of the Spirit is the Word of God: Let the very Breath of God be in you.




Join us Sunday mornings for worship service at 9:30 am.
